Our History

- Founded in 2002 as a playgroup of six children
- 2007 Moved from a Victorian home to St. Gregory of Nyssa's annex, Fully-licensed preschool with 60 students
- 2010: Raised \$500K over 3 years to fund current Dogpatch location designed by Michele Zini. Grew to 110 students
- Started elementary school in 2012 with 12 students then moved into two trailers with two classrooms in 2013: 140 students
- 2014: Raised 1M \$ built two additional classrooms in the Dogpatch and moved the elementary to our new Alamo square site: 170 students
- 2019: we moved to our third campus and now have over 300 students!
- Initially, Italian/Italian-American; now a very diverse and International community representing over 30 languages, and different family structures

The Board of Directors

La Scuola is a non profit 501 (c)3 independent school and is governed by a Board of Directors. The Head of School reports to the Board of Directors. Staff/Faculty report to their direct supervisor who report to the Head of School. The board has a fiduciary duty and obligation to lead the organization toward the fulfillment of its mission and purpose by:

- Stewarding La Scuola to achieve its mission and vision
- Overseeing short and long term strategic goals and strategic planning
- Ensuring that risk is managed, the business model and financial processes are sound and supporting the overall health of the institution

Reggio Emilia approach

- Children and teachers co- construct theories and test hypotheses through shared experiences and social interactions
- Inquiry based learning provokes creative thinking, problem solving and teamwork
- Projects/Inquiries are documented at the school through photos, art projects, weekly newsletter
- Children are protagonists of the learning process, not vessels that are to be filled with information
- Focus on the whole student: physical, intellectual, emotional, and social growth
- Parents, teachers, and children are mutual contributors in the acquisition of knowledge (co- constructivist approach)
- Environment is the "third teacher"



Language Immersion

Immersion Model: Montreal Model

- La Scuola is a "Scuola Parificata" (recognised by Italian Ministry of Education)
- We follow the Montreal Model of Language Immersion. Below are the language percentages through the grades. (Language percentages do not include specialist subjects.)

Preschool: approximately 95% Italian

Grades K-1: approximately 20% English – 80% Italian

Grade 2: approximately 30% English – 70% Italian

Grades 3-5: approximately 50% English – 50% Italian

Grades 6-8: approximately 70% English – 30% Italian

Advantages

- Cognitive Advantages: divergent thinking, promotes executive function (academic success)
- International Mindedness and Multicultural awareness
- Linguistic advantages: foundation for other language and academic English

Why IB?

- A worldwide network of Schools, working together to share best practice and high quality programmes of education from early childhood through to school graduation.
- Framing 'progressive' education
- Students develop knowledge, skills and dispositions that are relevant to the real world
